Boandik is a community based organisation providing a broad range of services to the aged and disabled in the Limestone Coast region of South Australia.

We have been providing services to the aged since 1956 and have a strong commitment to engage with the community and ensure that the range, quantity and quality of services meet the current and future needs of the region.

Our purpose is to partner with clients to enable them to live as they choose.

Boandik is governed by a community based board of directors who give freely of their time to ensure a progressive and innovative organisation.

How we can help

We recognise that every person is an individual and this is the most important consideration when making a decision about services. Boandik is committed to meeting the needs of each individual client and offers a wide range of services in a client's home, in independent living units and in residential homes.

We are here to enable each person to live as they choose.

Community care

We provide community care services to people living in their homes throughout the entire Limestone Coast region, there is no area of the region that we do not service.

The services are provided by staff who live in the same area as the client. Staff are selected in consultation with the client, with clients able to choose the time of service delivery. The services are provided through a variety of programs:

Home support program

This program is the entry level service, designed to provide low levels of support in a client's home or in a group.

Services include:

- Social support
- Domestic assistance
- Personal care and medication
- Transport for shopping and appointments
- Home maintenance
- Physiotherapy

Home care packages

The home care package program is designed to support people over the age of 65 who need a higher level of support to live independently in their own homes.

The client has the choice of care and services that they receive based on their individual needs.

A budget is provided that is based on the level of funding available for the package as well as the funds contributed by the client.

Disability packages

Support services are available for people with a disability. The client can choose the level of support from a broad range of services.



Residential care

Boandik provides residential care across four homes located in Mount Gambier.

The services are individualised based on information provided by the resident and their family and an assessment of care needs.

The aim is for each person to live a meaningful life as they choose, encouraging people to maintain their independence by providing the support they require in their daily living activities.

Residential care homes offer respite (pre-booked and emergency), permanent care and transition care.

Transition care

Transition care is a short term intervention available to people after an acute illness or operation.

The focus is on rehabilitation and support to enable a return to independent living. Transition care is provided in residential facilities and the client's home.

Independent living units

This accommodation is designed for people who can live independently.

A variety of accommodation options are available at the Lake Terrace site in Mount Gambier and the Sutton Court site in Port MacDonnell. Both sites are operated as retirement villages.

The recently constructed units are based on a "unit for life" design that meets the gold level under the *Liveable Housing Design Guidelines*.

The design allows people to age in place in the unit and access community services to support them as their needs change.

At Boandik we focus on the individual whether it be a client, representative, staff member or volunteer. The living and working environment is supportive and caring.

How much will it cost?

There is no ready reckoner for this. Charges are based on the financial circumstances of each person. Maximum fees are set by the Department of Health. We will work with each person to estimate the fees and accommodation payments.

This is simplified if the person has already completed the required income and asset assessment through the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) or the Department of Veterans Affairs. We can then sit down and talk through what would be best for you and how it will work.
